FACT SHEET - \$1-million FIVB World Championships presented by comdirect & ALDI Nord

Hamburg, Germany, June 28-July 7, 2019

Updated on **June 24, 2019**, this fact sheet provides information on the FIVB and the 2018-2019 World Tour calendar.

- The 2018-2019 FIVB World Tour calendar includes two five-star events, both are part of the Beach Major Series, 12 four-star events, 6 three-star events, 8 two-star events, and 29 one-star events, along with the FIVB World Championships and the World Tour Finals.
- One FIVB Age Group World Championships for players under the age of 21 will also be held along with an Olympic Qualification Tournament in September.
- The 2018-2019 World Tour began in August of 2018 in Hungary and will conclude in September of 2019 with The World Tour Finals in Rome, Italy.
- The 2018-2019 season marks the 33rd anniversary of the first FIVB Beach Volleyball event held February 17-22, 1987 in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.
- Eleven events played in 2018 in Hungary (Siofok), France (Montpellier), China (Zhongwei, Qinzhou, and Yangzhou), Iran (Bandar Torkaman, Babolsar, and Bandar Anzali), the United States (Las Vegas), Mexico (Chetumal), and Slovenia (Ljubljana) were a part of the 2018-2019 FIVB World Tour.
- The **FIVB World Championships** will be the 438th men's event and 405th women's event on the FIVB Beach Volleyball World Tour (open, grand slam, Olympic and Goodwill).
 - The first men's FIVB World Tour event was played February 17-22, 1987 in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil
 - The first women's event was played August 14-16, 1992 at Almeria, Spain.
- **FIVB Beach Volleyball World Championships** starts June 28 and concludes July 7. The winning teams in each gender will share the US\$60,000 first-place prizes. Here is the tentative schedule:

• Friday, July 5	Men's Round of 16 and Women's Quarterfinals and Semi-Finals
• Saturday, July 6	Men's Quarterfinals and Semi-Finals and Women's Medal Matches
• Sunday, July 7	Men's Medal Matches

FACT SHEET - \$1-million FIVB World Championships presented by comdirect & ALDI Nord

- A total of 96 teams from 37 countries (48 men's teams from 28 countries and 48 women's teams from 27 countries) representing all five Confederations have been selected to compete in the **FIVB Beach Volleyball World Championships**, including **Argentina** (1 men's team, 1 women's team), **Australia** (1,2), **Austria** (2,1), **Belgium** (1,0), **Brazil** (4,4), **Canada** (2,3), **Chile** (2,0), **China** (0,3), **Colombia** (0,1), **Cuba** (1,1), **Czech Republic** (1,0), **Egypt** (0,1), **Finland** (0,1), **Germany** (4,6), **Iran** (1,0), **Italy** (3,1), **Japan** (1,1), **Latvia** (2,1), **Mauritius** (0,1), **Mexico** (1,1), **Morocco** (1,0), **Mozambique** (1,0), **Netherlands** (1,2), **Nicaragua** (0,1), **Nigeria** (0,1), **Norway** (1,0), **Paraguay** (0,1), **Poland** (2,1), **Qatar** (2,0), **Russia** (4,2), **Rwanda** (1,1), **Slovak Republic** (0,1), **Spain** (1,1), **Switzerland** (1,2), **United States** (4,5), **Uruguay** (1,1), and **Venezuela** (1,0).
- June 28-July 7, FIVB World Championships, Men and Women, \$1,000,000** - The 12th edition of the FIVB Championships will be held at Am Rothenbaum Stadium in Hamburg, Germany.
 - Germany has hosted 30 previous FIVB World Tour events, beginning in 1995.
 - Berlin has hosted 24 of the events including the 2005 World Championships and Hamburg has hosted the other six, a double-gender Major Series event and the World Tour Finals in 2017 and 2018.
 - Host country Germany has won eight previous medals on its country's soil, including four men's medals (1 gold, 1 silver, 2 bronze) and four women's medals (2 gold, 1 silver, 1 bronze).

FIVB World Tour

- This year marks the 33rd anniversary of the first FIVB beach volleyball event held February 17-22, 1987 in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. The gold medal was won by USA's Sinjin Smith and Randy Stoklos.
 - The men's World Tour began in 1989, the women's in 1992. Smith and Stoklos were the champions of the inaugural season in 1989-90.
- The first women's event was held August 12-15, 1992 in Almeria, Spain where Americans Karolyn Kirby and Nancy Reno topped the podium.

FIVB World Tour Men's & Women's Highlights

The 2018-2019 FIVB World Tour calendar features US\$7.5 million in prize money, with 2 five-star events, both are Major Series, 12 four-star events, 6 three-star events, 8 two-star events, and 29 one-star events, as well as the FIVB World Championships and the World Tour Finals. One age-group FIVB World Championships, for players under the age of 21, will also be played.

- The 2018-2019 FIVB World Tour began in August of 2018 and will conclude in September 2019.
- The international beach volleyball circuit visits 56 sites in 37 countries over a thirteen-month period spanning from August 2018 to September 2019.
- The 2018-2019 FIVB Beach Volleyball World Tour calendar features 49 men's and 47 women's events within all five confederations (African, Asian, European, North American, and South American), offering US\$7.5 million in prize money.
- Both five-star events, the FIVB World Championships and the World Tour Finals are for both genders. The combined purse for the five-star events and World Tour Finals will be \$600,000, and the total purse will be \$1,000,000 for the FIVB World Championships.
- Both five-star events are Beach Major Series events, returning to their 2018 sites in Switzerland (Gstaad), and Austria (Vienna).
- The showcase events on the 2018-2019 FIVB World Tour is the FIVB Beach Volleyball World Championships in Hamburg, Germany from June 28-July 7 and the World Tour Finals in Rome, Italy from September 4-8.
- Eleven of the twelve four-star events are for both genders, while the event in Doha, Qatar is for men only. The double-gender events are in China (Yangzhou, Xiamen, and Jinjiang), the United States (Las Vegas), Netherlands (The Hague), Brazil (Itapema), Czech Republic (Ostrava), Poland (Warsaw), Portugal (Espinho), Japan (Tokyo), and Russia (Moscow). The purse for the four-star events is \$150,000 per gender.
- Four of the six three-star events are for both genders with a purse of \$75,000 per gender. The events for both genders are in China (Qinzhou), Australia (Sydney), Malaysia (Kuala Lumpur), and Canada (Edmonton). The event in Mexico (Chetumal) was for women only and the event in Latvia (Jurmala) will be for men only.
- Only two of the eight two-star events are for both genders with a purse of \$25,000 per gender. The double-gender events are in Turkey (Aydin) and China (Qidong). Zhongwei, China, Phnom Penh, Cambodia, Nanjing, China and Nantong, China are holding women's-only events. The event in Siem Reap, Cambodia is for men only.
- 16 of the 29 one-star events are for both genders with a purse of \$5,000 per gender. Events played in conjunction with the CEV will be paid in Euros. The double-gender events are in Hungary (Siofok and Budapest), France (Montpellier August 2018), Slovenia (Ljubljana in November 2018 and August 2019), India (Visakhapatnam), Thailand (Satun), Malaysia (Langkawi), Sweden (Gothenburg), Philippines (Boracay), Austria (Baden), Greece (Ios), Liechtenstein (Vaduz), Brazil (Miguel Pereira), Belgium (Knokke-Heist), and Rwanda (Rubawu). The single-gender events for men are in Iran (Bandar Torkaman, Babolsar, and Bandar Anzali), Cambodia (Kampong Speu), Italy (Pinarella di Cervia), Poland (Malbork), Oman (Salalah), France (Montpellier August 2019), and Norway (Oslo). The women's-only events are in Cambodia (Battambang), Vietnam (Tuan Chau Island) Korea (Daegu), and Italy (Alba Adriatica).
- The 2018-2019 FIVB Beach Volleyball calendar also included the FIVB Age Group World Championships for players under the age of 21 in Thailand (Samila Beach) from June 19-23. FIVB age-group worlds for U21 and U19 have been held for over a decade, once for U17 and two times for U23.
- Hungary opened the 2018-2019 FIVB World Tour calendar for the first time in the 33-year history of the tour with the double-gender FIVB Siofok One Star from August 23-26, 2018. The first five-star event will be in Switzerland (Gstaad) from July 9-14, 2019. China contested the first four-star event (Yangzhou) from October 10-14, 2018, the first three-star event (Qinzhou) from September 30-October 4, 2018, and the first two-star (Zhongwei) from September 14-16, 2018. The first one-star event was held in Hungary (Siofok) on August 23-26, 2018.
